63	<p>10 symbols of the Eucharist:</p> <p>Joseph side: left to right:  altar, loaves of fish, monstrance, wheat and grain, host (IHS on it which stands for Iesus Hominum Salvator, "Jesus the Savior of (all) Men</p> <p>Mary side: left to right:  lamb, manna from heaven/water from Moses' rock, fish (ichthus), chalice, pelican (from St. Thomas Aquinas: it was thought mistakenly that in a time of drought the pelican will slit a hole in its throat to feed its young, just as Jesus feeds us with his body in our spiritual drought)</p>
